2022 was a year of stability and growth for Zelie's Home. We served 29 moms and their 46 children residentially in 2022, providing for the physical, emotional, professional and spiritual needs of those we serve the best we can. We have been at our home in Garfield Heights for three years now, and the support of the community has been incredible.

In June of 2022, the U.S. Supreme Court issued its Dobbs ruling, increasing the need for the services we provide. Since that time, we have seen an increase in both moms seeking help and community support. In the second half of 2022, we made the decision to open a second home to meet these needs. We are honored and humbled to say that with the support of and partnership with the Diocese of Cleveland, we will be opening a second home in Lakewood in the middle of 2023!

We continue to refine our staffing model to meet the increased needs and better serve the moms and babies by creating new positions, changing the roles and responsibilities of existing positions and continuing our partnership with Notre Dame Mission Volunteers.

In addition to the guiding hand of Providence, we rely on the generosity of volunteers, donors, board members and the community at-large. We are blessed with a dedicated and high-performing staff that run Zelie's Home day-to-day. All of these factors (and more!) allow us to carry out our mission.

Our blessings are too great to count. Please continue to pray for us and support the moms and babies in need that we serve.

Our History







Zelie's Home, a home for homeless pregnant and parenting women in Cleveland, was formally established on July 1, 2020. Prior to that time, Zelie's Home was called The Zechariah House and was part of the Maggie's Place family, based in Arizona.

The Zechariah House started in Parma, Ohio in June of 2009, operating on the strong foundation of Maggie's Place's mission and practices.

Local foundations and donors have been eager to support Zelie's Home mission with generous funding. Our vision is to continue to offer a community where women can thrive as they embrace motherhood.



In December 2022, Desiree had been homeless and using drugs for two-and-a-half years. She was also eight months pregnant. She had a counselor who was trying to help her overcome her substance abuse and she got Desiree in touch with Zelie's Home.

Desiree says she was "blessed" to be accepted into Zelie's within five days of that initial contact. She added, "I had nothing when I got here."

Baby Bella was born only a few weeks later and Desiree is keeping busy with her newborn as well as figuring out how to maintain her sobriety.

Zelie's Home offers programming which helps residents like Desiree acquire life skills that will enable her to achieve independence. One of the programs is a financial literacy class that teaches her how to manage money and pay bills. Another class called "Seeking Safety" is a trauma- and addiction-informed evidence-based program, which is helping Desiree develop coping skills, set boundaries, and form healthy relationships. By focusing on the present and remaining emotionally grounded, she is learning to cultivate safer relationships, thinking, and actions.

A case manager helps her obtain housing and food stamps. A pediatric chiropractor recently visited Zelie's Home and taught Desiree and the other moms about the developmental milestones that their babies should be reaching. "They set goals so that we can be prepared when we leave here. The staff here is amazing!" Desiree explained. She is very appreciative of the volunteers and workers who take her to her doctor appointments, WIC programs, and grocery shopping.

Desiree says she plans to relocate to the west side of Cleveland once she leaves Zelie's Home this October. Her goals include getting her own apartment and going back to school to become a dental assistant. Desiree also plans to stay connected with the place that helped her get back on her feet. "I really love being here. I enjoy it."

She isn't sure of her focus area of study yet, but is considering pediatrics. What a great role model for the moms of Zelie's Home and all of us! Zelie's Home has been blessed to have Chrissy as staff, friend, supporter, cheerleader, and mentor. Thank you Chrissy and good luck in medical school.

Women serving Women

Stories of women serving women, young and older, sharing life's journeys, are stories that continue to inspire. Women forge bonds with each other during difficult days and happy moments and in doing so, bring new life and hope to the lives and circumstances around them. So, it is at Zelie's Home, where pregnant and parenting women without a home come to get on their feet so they can take good care of themselves and their children. Essential to their growth as women and mothers are the volunteers who come regularly to the Home to share their gifts, their wisdom, their love and to be enriched by the young women they encounter.

Among these volunteers are four women: Ann Jordan, Theresa Fallon, Sr. Mary Lou Teckman, and Kris Vehar. Each week Ann, Theresa and Sister Mary Lou arrive at the Home for their "shift." Ann is a widow, a former medical technologist and the proud grandmother of seven grandchildren, one of whom studies at the seminary in the Diocese of Cleveland. She first volunteered at the Home in 2009 when it was part of Maggie's Place in Parma. When it moved to Garfield Heights, Ann's inner draw to the mission took her back to the women and children. On any given Thursday at 1:00 p.m. Ann arrives with her quiet and gentle manner and is welcomed by Baraka, a toddler at the Home who refers to her as "his friend" because Ann always has time to play with him, no matter what else she has to do.

Theresa Fallon's shift follows Ann's on Thursday afternoon. Married to her husband Jimmy for 31 years, together they have three children, all grown and out of the house. Theresa is an empty nester with experience in motherhood, special education and a job at a golf course. Like Ann, she sensed a draw for "something more" in her life and began volunteering at Zelie's Home. She is another one of Baraka's "friends," loves holding babies, is especially good with moms who are struggling, and enjoys getting to know the staff. Periodically, she helps with an overnight shift.

At 9:00 on Friday mornings, Sr. Mary Lou Teckman, a Sister of Notre Dame, appears at the door. With babies at different stages of growth, having enough diapers of each size is important, and Sister takes care of that. It was the example of her niece, Maggie, with two children in daycare that inspired Sr Mary Lou to volunteer at the former Maggie's Place. She brings that love and concern she had for her niece to the moms and babies at Zelie's Home and as a member of a religious congregation shares God's love and goodness through her generous and faithful presence.

In meeting Kris Vehar, a member of St. Joan of Arc Parish and the Elizabeth Ministry there, it is evident that Kris, a full-time nurse, is a busy woman. She is married to her husband, Kenny, a math teacher and partner with Kris in ministry to the mission of Zelie's Home. Together they have five children. On a monthly basis Kris brings a wonderful meal prepared by women at St. Joan Parish for the women at Zelie's Home. And, in between, when the Home holds special events, such as the Thanksgiving dinner for alumnae, their children, and current residents, Kris, Kenny and family members, along with friends, arrive in vans with roasters filled with turkey and all the trimmings. Kris serves with joy and invites others to do the same. The fruitfulness of her life finds its roots in a living faith that seeks to serve and is aware of all she receives from the moms and staff at Zelie's Home.

Women serving women, younger women at Zelie's Home prepare to give birth and parent their babies. Other women, a widow, an empty nester, a Catholic Sister, a busy wife and mother, are among those who offer support for the journey. Together, they are a community, sharing their lives and gifts with each other.

Social Service Partner Murtis Taylor and Alfrie Hudson

When two or more organizations come together to achieve a common goal, the chances of obtaining that goal increase exponentially. When your life's work is increasing the quality of life for others, partnering with like-minded people and organizations is a no brainer. Collaborating with organizations gives us the opportunity to improve the range of services we provide our moms.

Alfrie Hudson, Senior Manager at Murtis Taylor for the Garfield Heights location, first connected with the mission of Maggie's Place, now Zelie's Home in 2019. Former social services director for Maggie's Place, Jermeka Jackson showed up to a safe sleep class that Alfrie was facilitating, which led them to exchange contact information. After falling in love with the mission of Maggie's Place, Alfrie referred Jermeka to the Garfield Collaborative. Since then, a solid partnership was established.

In 2020, when the Board of Directors of The Zechariah House decided to establish a home independent of Maggie's Place, Zelie's Home was born - same spirit and mission of Maggie's Place but designed to address the unique needs of the women and children in the Cleveland area. Maggie Roe, Programs Coordinator, became the contact person for Zelie's Home, allowing Alfrie to continue her connections with the moms. Alfrie loves that Zelie's Home works with the moms after birth which gives them time to bond with their child.

Alfrie says she's been in the world of human services her whole life. Born and raised in Chicago, she knows firsthand what it's like to be homeless because she spent a portion of her youth living in shelters. Arriving in Cleveland as an adult, she lived at Laura's Home for four months. From there she enrolled in Baldwin Wallace, then became an AmeriCorps member, where she immediately began giving back to the community that helped her.

One of Alfrie's memorable moments with Zelie's Home occurred in the fall of '22, where she was facilitating an active parenting series at the Garfield Heights Library; three of our moms were a part of the group. Alfrie remembers this group like no other because there were only five in total so the Zelie's Home moms stood out. She says they were engaged the entire time, which unfortunately, she does not witness often. Those classes let her know that the ladies were being uplifted at Zelie's Home. As Alfrie wonderfully stated, "God reminds me that all it takes is for me to plant the seed; somebody else is going to come water it, somebody is going to fertilize it, somebody else is going to watch it grow. It's not important for me to see all the stages but just that I planted the seed."

Mike and Emily Stangl

"She had her whole life ahead of her." Emily and Mike Stangl were introduced to Zelie's Home through a heartbreaking tragedy: the death of their little girl. Matilda "Tilly" Poppy Stangl was born in July of 2021, and, after a hard-fought fight in the NICU, she passed away just a few months later. With a house full of diapers and wipes, Emily and Mike asked their pastor where they could be donated, and he directed them to Zelie's Home.

In learning about Zelie's Home, the Stangls came to greatly admire the mission of providing a safe space for women and children while uplifting and empowering the women in their care. They were able to donate all their diapers and wipes to Zelie's Home, but they didn't stop there.

Wanting to honor their daughter in a special way, they decided to open a Foundation in her name, the Matilda Poppy Stangl Foundation. As part of the foundation, they decided they would host an event each year and choose an organization to donate their proceeds to that coincided with how old Tilly would have been. For their first year, they donated the proceeds of their golf outing to Zelie's Home. "It was a no-brainer," Emily noted. They set out to plan their first golf outing with a goal of \$15,000. They far exceeded this goal and were able to raise \$40,000 for Zelie's Home. Emily and Mike said that they were completely overwhelmed by the support and success of their first event.

Though Mike and Emily will be choosing a different organization every year for their daughter Tilly, they still plan to do what they can to continue to support Zelie's Home in the future, as it will always be near and dear to their hearts. The coming together of these two

organizations has been so fruitful. Mike shared a story about how he was able to attend the annual Zelie's Home golf event where he won the 50/50 and donated all the proceeds back to Zelie's Home. It all came full circle when the executive director of Zelie's Home, Erin Hathaway, and her husband, Adolph, attended an event for Emily and Mike's Foundation and also won the 50/50 and donated all the proceeds back to the Matilda Poppy Stangl Foundation. It's always nice to get a little "wink" from heaven that the Lord is taking care of everything.

In losing their daughter Tilly, Emily and Mike used their pain and heartache as an opportunity to give glory to God. For many of the past and present residents of Zelie's Home, trauma and heartache are no strangers either. Mike and Emily are incredible witnesses to all the women of Zelie's Home in how God uses even the biggest tragedies in our lives and transforms them into something beautiful. The coming together of these two foundations allowed the Stangls to honor their little girl and allowed Zelie's Home to continue to live out its mission with a generous donation of \$40,000. This donation will allow Zelie's Home to continue providing safe shelter and case management for the women in their care. It will also help Zelie's Home as they have plans to expand into a second location so they can help even more women and children.
